NATURE IN EASTON 5

I have been watching Common darter dragonflies in the Brook opposite my house, flying 'in tandem' just above the water among the Water Plantain and Celery-leaved Buttercup, the red male in front dipping regularly to allow the female to test the water for oviposition sites. Immature males avoid water until they are ready to compete with other patrolling males for the opportunity to mate. August has been an especially good month for Hedge Brown

butterflies this year; now you should look out for autumn broods of Common Blues and Comma butterflies. My garden has been crawling with Grass snakes this summer and Geoff Prigmore saw one on the 'Baker' path above Hartham Street. Has anyone else seen one? Botanically, August has been noteworthy for two rare plants: I discovered some Winter wild oats among a lot of Common wild oats in a bean field along the Spaldwick track, and Saw-wort in an old meadow on the Burton's Lodge Farm. Winter wild oats has only been recorded once before in Huntingdonshire and there are only four other known sites for Saw-wort. I found it in two Easton meadows in 1969, both long since ploughed up.
